







# 1982 AMREF celebrates 25 years

- Treated nearly 1 millions people
- Immunized 1.2 million others
- Travelled over 250,000 kilometres in bush country
- Flown over 9 million kilometres (equivalent of 12 trips round the moon)
- Performed more than 22,000 major operations
- Evacuated more than 1000 emergency cases
- Handled over 200,000 radio calls
- Trained hundreds of thousands of health auxiliaries through health education programmes and manuals









- STD intervention trial in Mwanza region funded by EU started following a cohort of 12,000 individuals for a period of 2 years












Dr Miriam Were, AMREF Chair, called upon the First Lady to "inspire us with her leadership, and help curb the continuous expansions of the disease, and the distress it causes."

In his address, Dr Daraus Bukenya, AMREF in Janain Country Director, drew attention to the plight of orphans, estimating that in the next 7 years there would be 40 million AIDS orphans in the region. He added that the poor and the disadvantaged were the hardest hit by the epidennic. "AMREF is building the capacity of institutions and governments by providing information and access to Voluntary Counselling and Texting and causing that quality assurance systems are in place. We believe that the mainstay in AMREF is prevention," he said.






