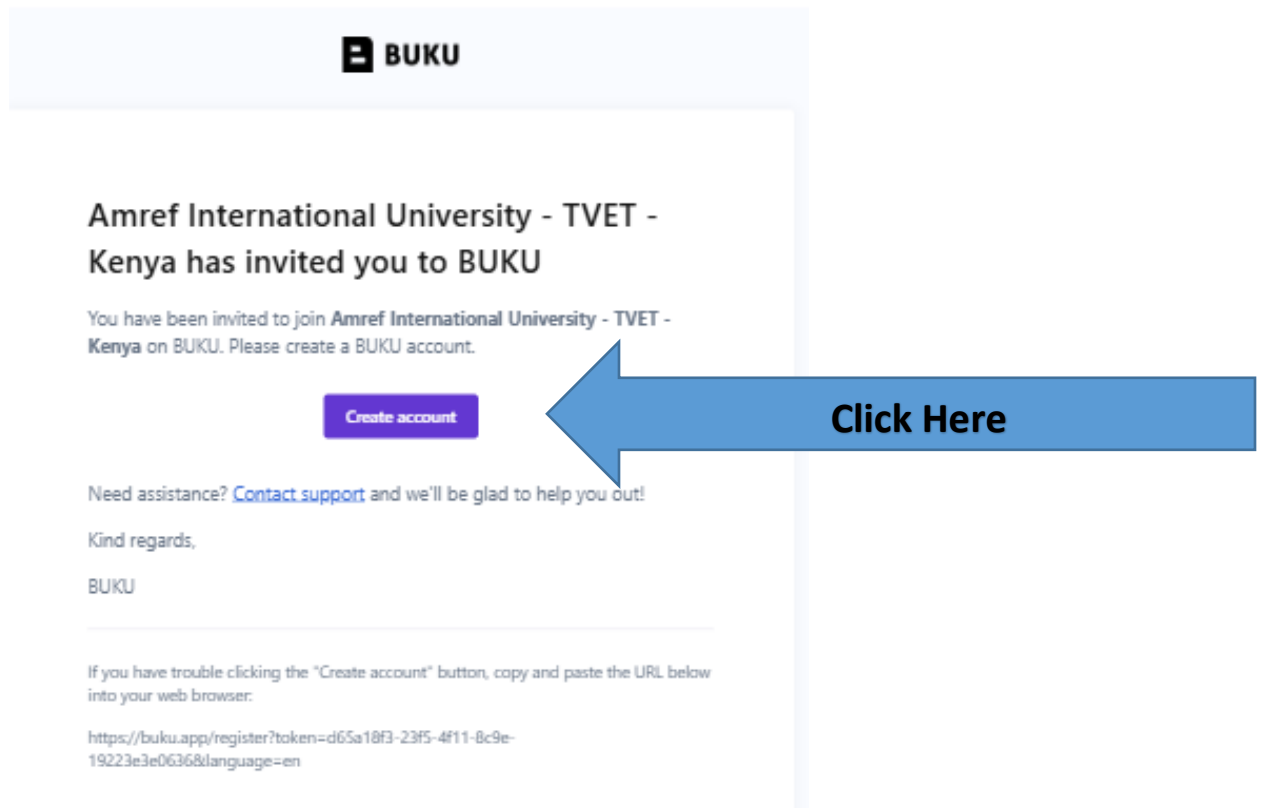
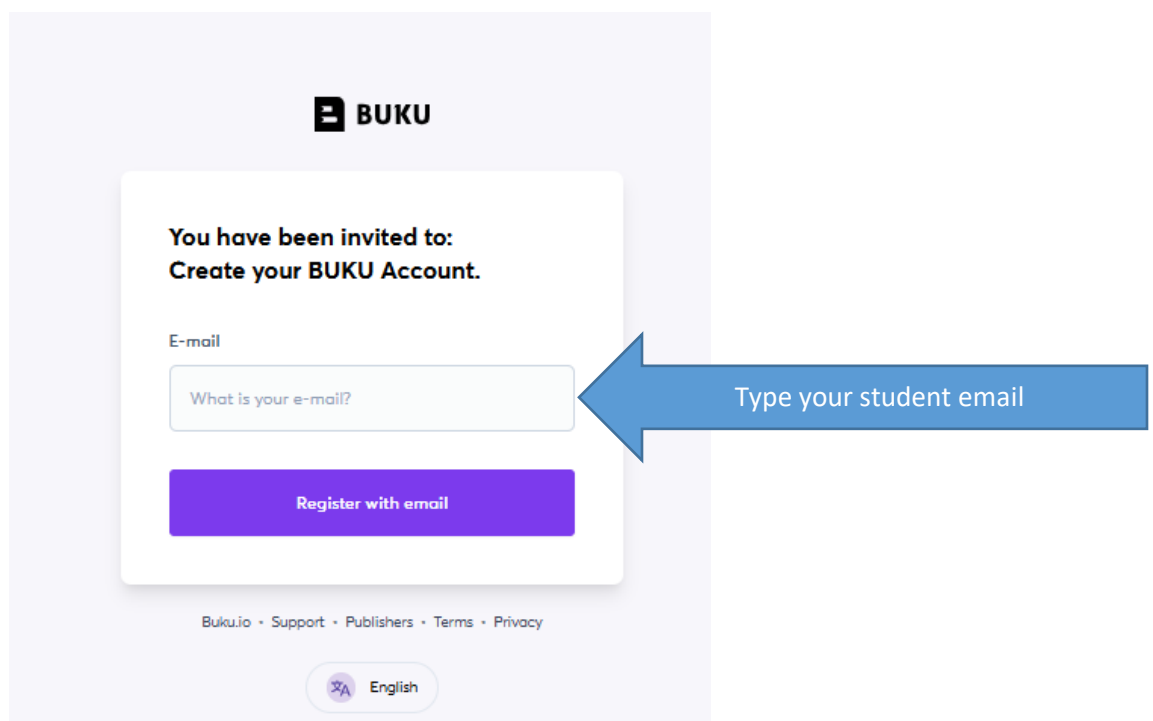


GUIDE ON USING BUKU AT AMREF INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY (AMIU)


1. As a student at AMIU you have access to BUKU a database for E-books.
2. The Library will register you to BUKU using your student email address.
3. Once registered, you will receive a welcome message in your email inbox as shown below:



4. Click on "Create account" it will take you to the page below




5. Enter your student email and create a password:

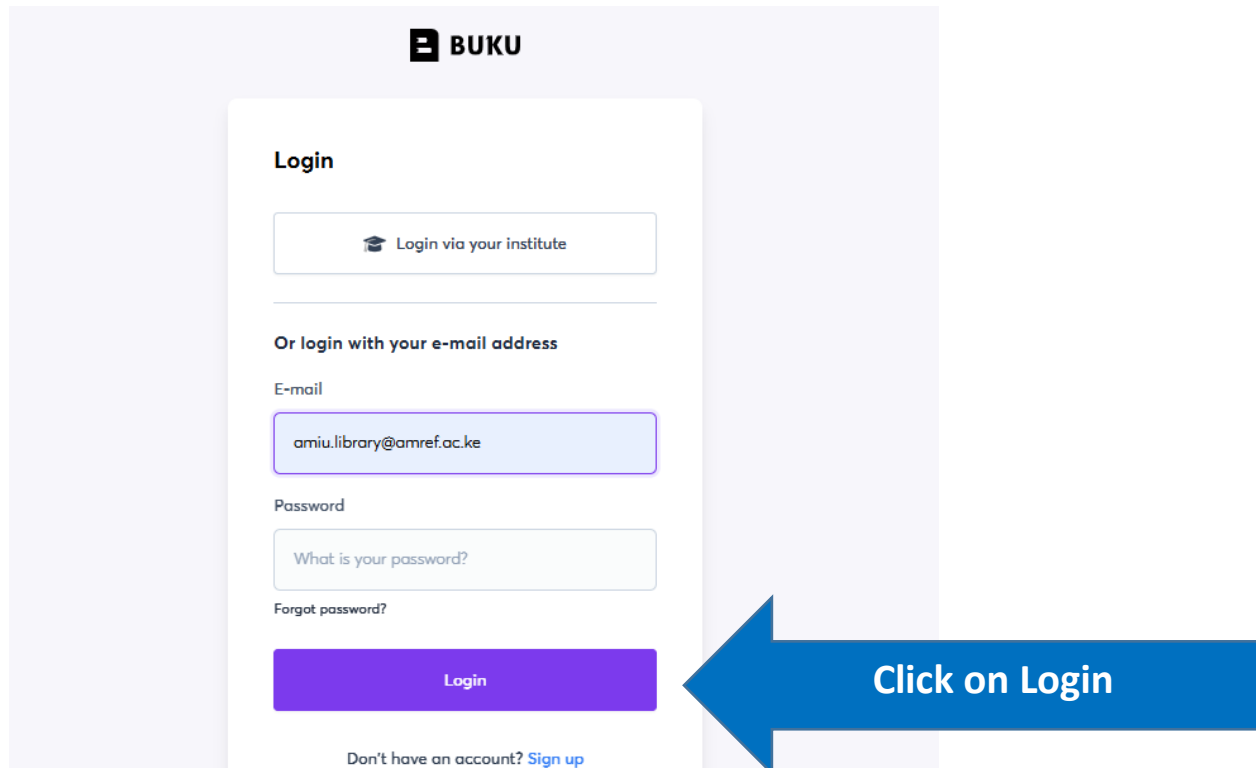

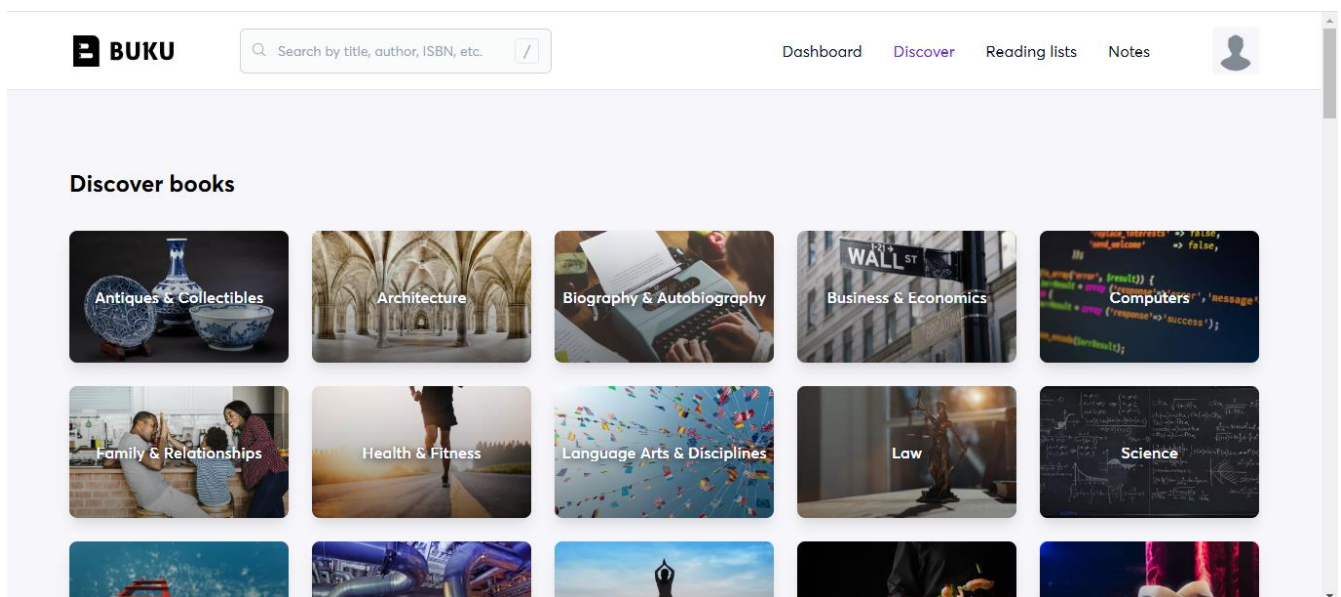

7. Once you login, this page will appear;



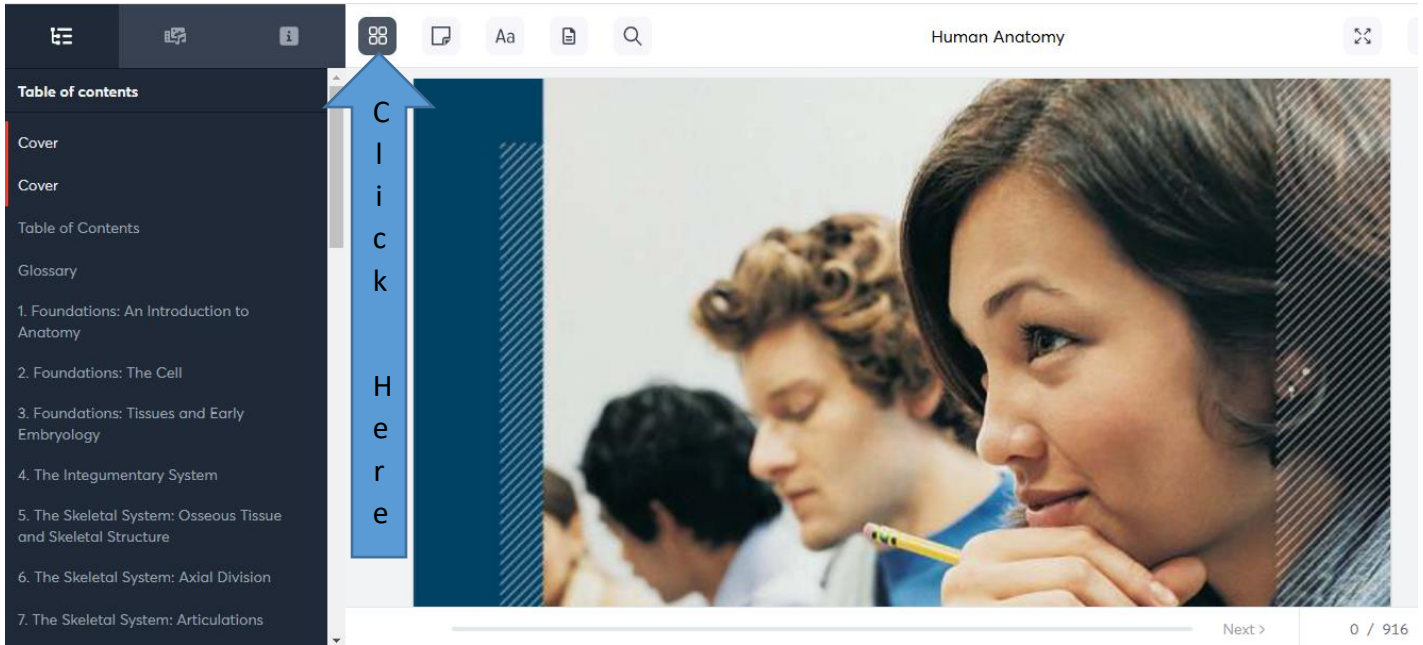
8. Begin your search by typing a key word on the search bar. For example Human Anatomy

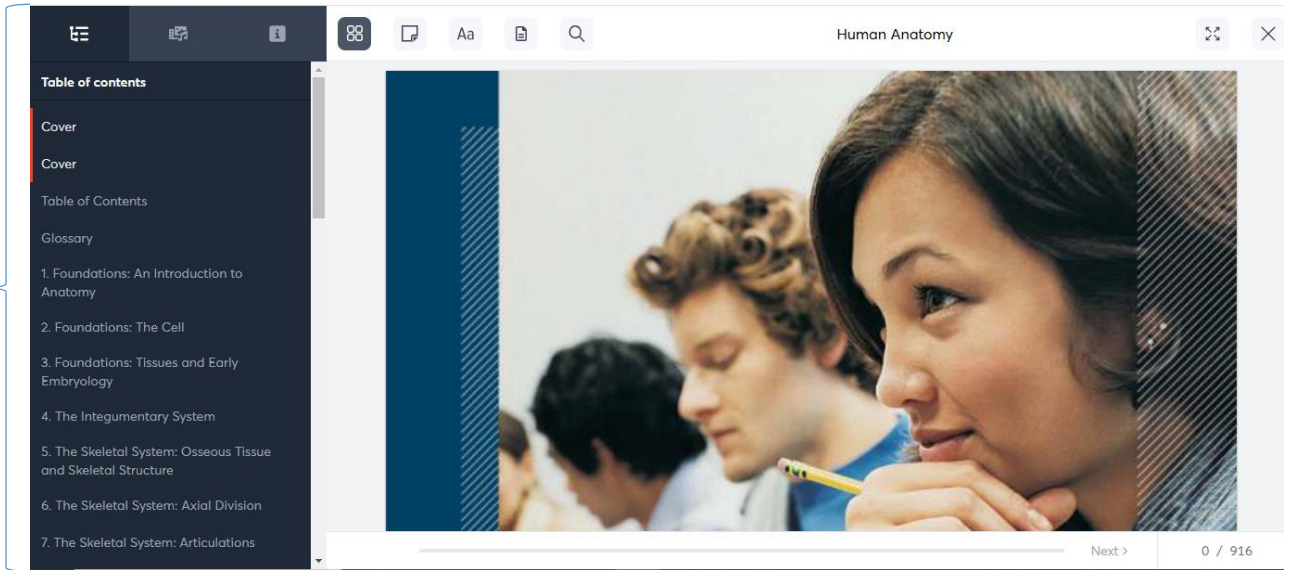
9. Click on the preferred book to open;

12. You can read the book online.

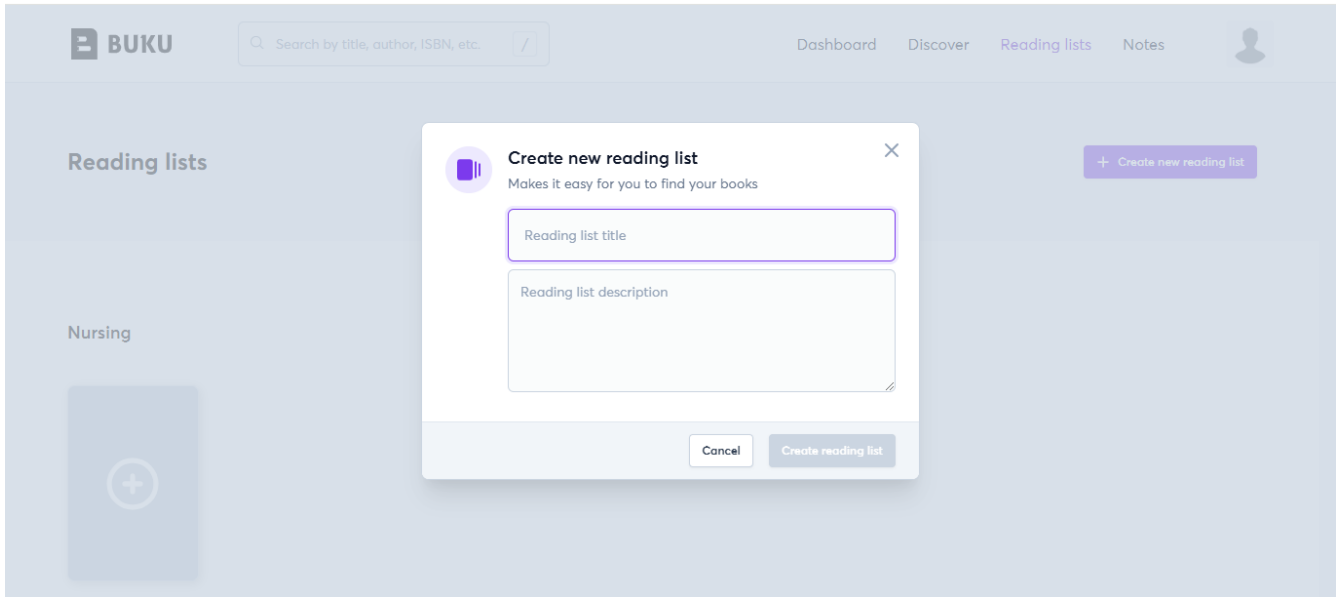
13. You can highlight the book by clicking as shown below and make notes.

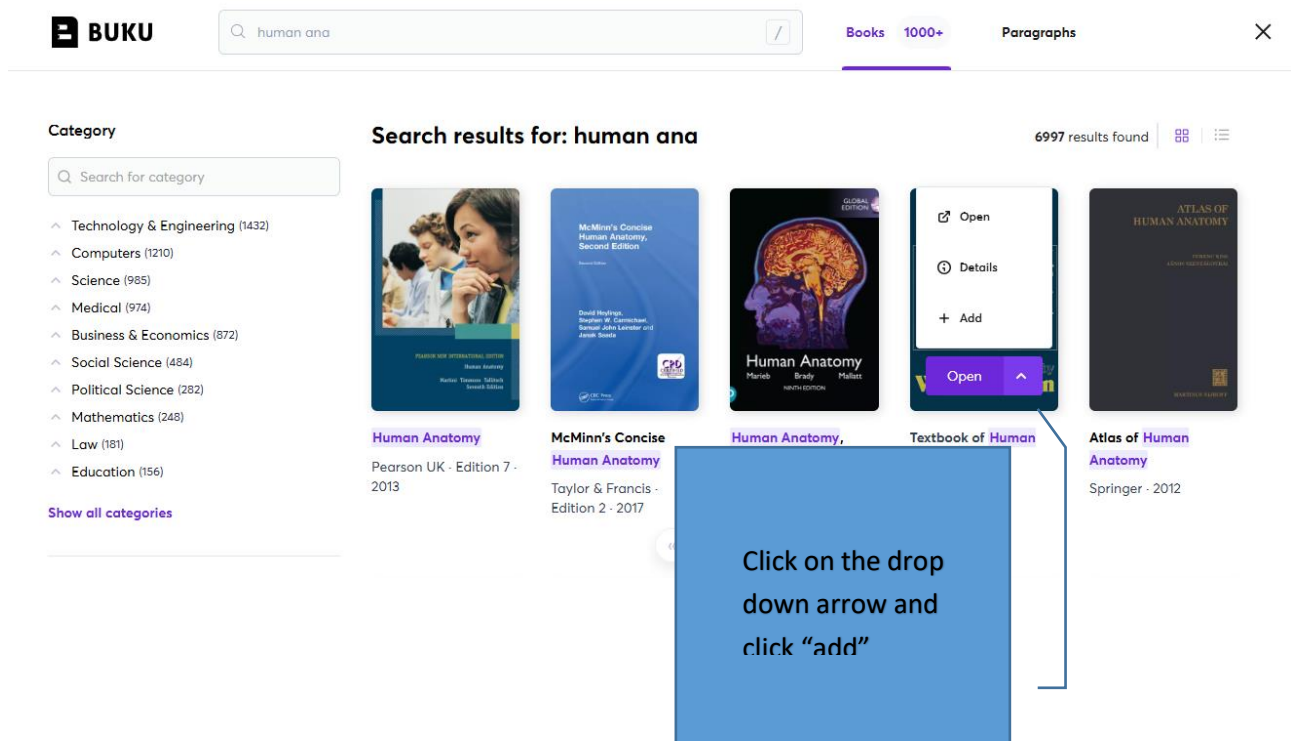
14. You can create reading lists and add books as shown below;

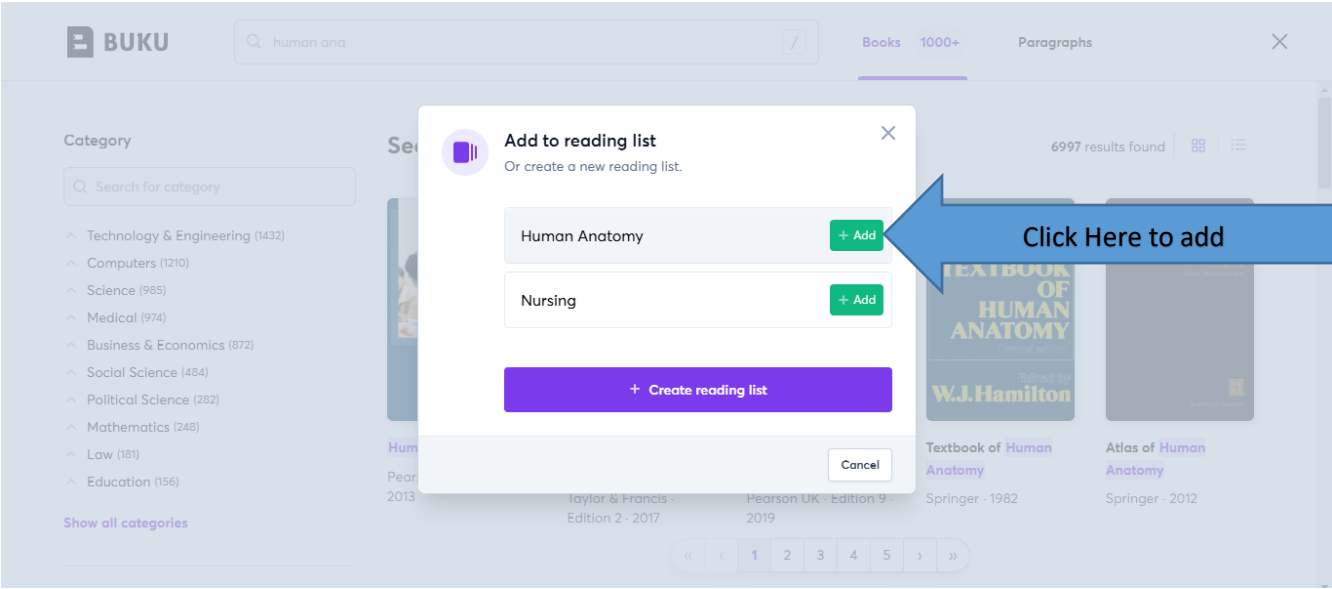
15. Create a Title for your Reading List
